New Testament Reading: Romans 8.18-25

I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 6.25-34

‘Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?’

‘And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you – you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, “What shall we eat?” or “What shall we drink?” or “What shall we wear?” For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

Midweek Communion for Lent:

Lent is a time to reflect on our personal journeys of faith and our relationship to God. While we can do that by ourselves, some people may find it helpful to join with others.

We begin with a service on Ash Wednesday at All Saints, Yatesbury on Wednesday 18th February at 1pm. We will be sharing Holy Communion together, but there will also be the opportunity to reaffirm your commitment to following Jesus faithfully through the imposition of ashes on your forehead.

On the middle 5 Wednesdays of Lent (25th February to 25th March inclusive) at 9.30am in Cherhill, we will once again be holding a simple service of Holy Communion, with no singing and only a short reflection. We will be following the order of the Book of Common Prayer, although with slightly updated language.
